


#### Reading Literature:


First graders were introduced to nonfiction to build their literature skills

#### Comprehension:

Students have been continuing to learn to identify the main topic and provide information using illustration. They learned



Reading is the KEY to learning




Students were introduced to new vocabulary words, as well as high frequency words. The spelling words were practiced in class in various ways. Ask your child what they would like their occupation to be when they grow older! (Occupation is one of their oral vocabulary words).

#### Phonics:

Students were introduced to short /u/ and ending consonant blends such as /nd/, /nk/, /nt/, /st/, /sk/, /mp/, /sh/, /sh/, /wh/, /ph/, /tch/and /ch/. In the next few weeks, they will be learning their long vowels.

#### Writing:

Students read about fantasy genre and wrote a fantasy story about an imaginary character who is helping the community. They also wrote about what career they will pick when they grow up. They are learning to organize their paragraphs with a sense of beginning middle and sense of closure.







# Language Arts:

First graders learned that there are two kinds of nouns: common and proper nouns. They learned to distinguish between the two. They learned about singular and plural nouns as well. They

know that not all nouns follow the plural rule of adding an -s or - es and at the of the word and that some nouns like to make up their rule when there is more than one. Ask your child to give you an example of an irregular plural noun and when do



we add an -es to make a noun plural.

#### Mathematics:

Our first graders have been introduced to subtraction and subtraction word problems, also they learnt that addition and subtraction are related.

They were excited to learn about fact families and that a fact family has 2 addition and 2 subtraction sentences. We will continue to use addition and subtraction to solve problems by writing number sentences.








# Science

Students learned how animals eat and grow. They differentiated animals by the type of food they eat like herbivore and carnivore. They also studied about how animals grow and change, adding up to their animal craze will




be a follow up field trip to the zoo by the end of the month.

### Social Studies

Our first graders learned about the 7 continents and 5 oceans. They also learned about the different landforms and created their

own landform models with the help of salt dough. They reviewed their four seasons and learned that people do fun activities in each of them. Ask your child what word we use to describe activities people do for fun and give you an example for each of the season.








Quran Sr. Sauda:

#### Dear respected parents, and students

Alhamdulillah on October 11, 2019 we marked the end of the first quarter! Students had an opportunity to reflect on their behavior in Qur'an class during the first quarter through a self assessment, and wrote down their goals to improve in the second quarter. I am so very proud of all my first graders who have been work-

ing hard through out the quarter to read and recognize simple words in their mushaf! Ma Sha Allah students completed their study of Surah Al-Maa'un and listed ways in which small acts of kindness can help make a big difference in their communities. Students analyzed the words of surah Al -Maa'un, Al-Feel, and even watched a video on surah Ar-Rahman to learn of how Allah SWT directs us to look or observe. Students used this information in their unit three STEAM performance tasks to identify problems within their community. For the unit four STEAM performance task students learnt a hadith of Prophet Muhammad SAW and reflected on the teachings of the Qur'an that direct our actions towards environmental sustainability. Students also refreshed their memories with an interactive video on Surah Al-Feel, they read the surah with attention to tajweed and correct pronunciation of letters and discussed three very important lessons they learnt from this surah, and how they can apply them in their lives In Sha Allah! Of the many fun interactive activities we did, students enjoyed the heavy letters activity in particular, where I brought in a heavy jar filled with heavy letters that students opened and discovered. Stu-



dents then made their very own heavy letter jars! In nooranniah students enjoyed the word games we played to spell, read and recognize simple three letter words with single and double vowels! Students are currently on nooranniah lesson 7, the mini long vowels. Until next time, please ask your responsible first grader to keep up with their Qur'an homework, continue to show respect through the use of polite words, and for this month's theme, put an honest effort forth in all that they do! 







