4th Grade

4th-5th Language Arts and Reading

The objective of English Language Arts (ELA) is to help our students grow into critical readers, writers, and thinkers. Fourth and fifth graders studied the following in the first quarter:

Grammar: Different types of sentences, subjects, predicates, run-on sentences, and punctuation.

Reading: We covered realistic fiction, narrative nonfiction, biography, persuasive article, and fairy tale. Once we read the selections together in class, we review and answer questions in the workbook to develop a deeper understanding of the text. The aim is to get the students to stop and ask themselves questions about a section when they read, such as *Why did this event happen?*, and *What are the main ideas in this selection?*

Please remind your child to submit the monthly *Book It* reading forms so that they can get credit for the books they have read that month. They also get a coupon for a free Pizza Hut pan pizza!

Participation in the reading program is optional.

Spelling: In addition to the weekly spelling words that are part of each lesson, we started to cover the Spelling Bee words for the competition to be held inshAllah early next year. Though it is optional, please encourage your child to participate in the Spelling Bee!

Vocabulary: Each week we learn new words that appear in the many texts that the students read. InshAllah knowing these vocabulary words will help them become better readers.

Writing: We are exploring different forms of writing, such as personal narratives and persuasive. InshAllah they will be completing a joint ELA and Social Studies writing project that is a persuasive essay. Fourth graders are writing to persuade readers about the importance of conservation. Fifth graders are writing to convince readers about the best colony in which to settle. (*see pic*)

In addition, the fourth grade completed an in-class reading project which entailed raising money for a worthy cause. This project was based on the theme of giving back to your community, so we set up a lemonade stand during school lunch times to raise funds for hurricane relief. Funds collected will be donated to Islamic Relief, inshAllah. We raised \$170, Alhamdulillah! (*see pic*)

InshAllah, as an effort to promote STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and math), I would like to establish more joint projects with other STEAM subjects to highlight ELA within the other subjects.
